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| SCENE | A prime mover in the progressive upscale dining scene in Columbia, S.C., Motor Supply works with sustainable, local farms and is known for its excellent wines, artisan cocktails, casual atmosphere and daily-changing, chef-driven menu. The bistro is popular with legislators, executives, business lunchers, creatives, young professionals, movers and shakers, ladies who lunch, hipster bar diners and business travelers. |

| CUISINE | New World, made-from-scratch cuisine with an emphasis on farm-to-table and a Slow Food philosophy of supporting good, clean and fair foodways. Chef Fulmer buys from local sustainable, organic and near-organic farms, using classical French culinary techniques to create contemporary American, Asian, Mediterranean and vegetarian dishes with Southern influences for the daily changing menu. |
| MENU | Mostly everything not locally sourced is made in-house, including stocks, sauces, dressings, infused vodkas, gins, bourbons and tequilas; barrel-aged craft cocktails and desserts. Brunch: \$11 - \$22; Lunch: \$12 - \$19; Dinner: \$18 - \$32 |
| ACCOLADES | Landing the number five spot in Southern Living's 2019 readers' poll of The South's Best Restaurants, Motor Supply has been featured in <i>The Local Palate</i> magazine, <i>Food Network</i> online, and mentioned by <i>Food & Wine Magazine</i> online, <i>Delta Sky</i> , <i>Travel + Leisure</i> , <i>Fodor's Travel</i> and the UK's <i>Telegraph</i> , Fulmer and his culinary team have led Motor Supply to all three major local readers' choice awards for "Best Restaurant" in 2015-2019 (<i>The State</i> , <i>Free Times</i> and <i>Columbia Metropolitan Magazine</i>). |
| INTERIOR | Upscale dining with an unpretentious atmosphere. Historic brick walls, exposed wooden beams and industrial iron elements with warm hues, large windows and sophisticated accents create a unique and welcoming atmosphere. Temperature-controlled patio with roll-up garage door windows and reclaimed N.C. barn wood tables by local company Bricker and Beam. Rotating canvases by S.C. artists, curated by local gallerist Bohumila Augustinova. Diners can browse through the legendary Carol Saunders Gallery next door. |
| HISTORY | Motor Supply Co. Bistro, located in the historic Congaree Vista district in downtown Columbia, is housed in a circa-1846 brick building that once served as the original "Motor Supply Co.," one of several independently- |

owned warehouses supplying motor parts throughout G.A. and S.C. from the 1930s—1960s. The building, which is listed on the National Register of Historic Places, was completely refurbished, including the reinstallation of the original 1930s neon sign, discovered by the owners in the basement.
